


# THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO IS PAUSING ACADEMIC **ASSESSMENT IN AY 25-26!**

- This break will allow academic programs to refresh their approach to assessment, reflect on program success, and review their internal assessment structures/committees.
- This will provide time for the Office of Assessment & APR to improve templates and processes.
- The pause and restart will allow all UNM academic units to be on the same • assessment planning and reporting cycle.
- The restart puts UNM on a timeline that aligns with the Higher Learning • Commission accreditation cvcle.



## Assessment Recharge & Reset year

AY 24-25 Program assessment data collection and analysis is still occurring and is due in Fall 2025 to your CARC Chair/Assessment Representative based on your school or college internal deadlines.

This institutional pause does not apply to General Education assessment. The GE cycle continues with the collection and submission of student artifacts annually.

7Any branch participating in the new branch assessment model will continue their assessment cycle as usual through general education assessment.

Is your survey tool leaving you wanting more?

Qualtrics is the newest tool available here at UNM. The possibilities are seemingly endless with options. Simple designs are relatively easy to create with toggles for question type, format, question behavior, and requirement. Specifically, you can force a response or simply request one. If you need respondents to provide you with materials or files, question types exist to upload these.

Using a combination of display logic and dependent question blocks, tailoring what a respondent sees is highly customizable. Response choices can be brought forward from selections in previous questions. Answers can be used to generate text in future questions. All of this comes together to make something that can feel more personal to your audience.

Be aware that a Back button is not default and requires addition in the Look and Feel section, as well as a progress bar. Both are recommended practices in any survey.
